Well, this is a quick, fun game that your child can use to practice spelling. By putting the pieces together to form the chore word, the child has another opportunity to not only see the word, but work with it from segments to the whole. Some combinations are compound nouns, others two-word separable verbs, and others just simple words. If you are practicing grammar, you can extend it by classifying the combinations into the different parts of speech (nouns, verbs, adjectives). It s up to you! Be creative with it. Here are a couple of suggestions:

- 1) Print and cut out the word sections
- 2) Have the children match the two sections and create the chore words
- 3) Once they have them matched you can categorize them into the different parts of speech (Ex. Clean is an adjective which gives more information about the kind of table we would like to have after we do our chore. Table is a noun because it is an object or thing and can be described by an adjective)
- 4) After they are all matched, have the children put their icons next to the words that they have matched up. This is just another form of visual confirmation of the spelled word.
